

### Elsie Cook is inducted into the Scottish Football Hall of Fame as autobiography launches



**♦** Isie Cook has been inducted to the Scottish Football Hall of Fame for her outstanding contribution to football, as a player but also as a pioneering administrator and champion of the girls and women's game. The celebrations took place at the Scottish Football Museum at Hampden Park today, Thursday 7th August 2025, as her autobiographical book, 'A Kiss Fae Pele' was launched.

Elsie's book launch was hosted by journalist, author and great friend of Elsie, Hugh MacDonald, who spoke of his own admiration for Elsie and welcomed friends and former colleagues to the stage to share stories and tributes to the woman of the hour.

Elsie's induction marks a new chapter in the Scottish Football Hall of Fame, as the Board and team at the Scottish Football Museum relaunch the project to bring the cohort of women inductees into balance.

A player with the successful Stewarton Thistle team of the 1960s and 1970s, Elsie was a leading figure in the creation of the Scottish Women's Football Association in 1972. A driving force behind the development of the women's game during a crucial era in the overall history of the sport, she stepped up to become the inaugural secretary of the organisation at a time when the Scottish FA did not even recognise women's football.

She was instrumental in organising the first official international football match involving the Scotland Women's National Team. That historic game took place in November 1972 at Ravenscraig stadium in Greenock when Scotland faced England. Elsie resigned as secretary and was appointed Scotland manager in 1974. She took the team on a tour of Italy, playing in Ravenna and Milan. She also played an important role in the formation of the Strathclyde League during the late 1970s and early 1980s. Through Elsie's determination, the women's game in Scotland emerged as a more structured sport.



### Words of thanks to a legend of the game

Friend and publisher of 'A Kiss Fae Pele', Tom Brown, has been an integral part of Elsie's book reaching publication. In true Elsie style, the book is written in the Stewarton vernacular (complete with a glossary of Scots words) as she wanted to maintain authenticity and is a comprehensive look back through meticulous records and photos kept by Elise over the decades and organised by Tom. Speaking of the respect and admiration Tom has for his great friend, he said: "When I say Elsie is a remarkable woman, it feels like I am not doing her justice. Her greatness is well camouflaged for, if you were to meet her and talk to her, she remains humble and understated. Her mission in life in life was to give all women of all ages the opportunity to play football."



On the importance of the work Elsie has done, Richard McBrearty, Curator of the Scottish Football Museum said: "I cannot think of anyone who has fought more for the women's game in Scotland than Elsie Cook. As a player, coach, administrator, advocate and activist, Elsie has been an inspirational presence within women's football from the early 1960s to the present day. The much-advanced game of today has been built upon the shoulders of pioneers, many of them unsung heroines. Standing at the front is Elsie - she is truly as colossus of the women's game."

Speaking of the new wave of change to bring the Hall of Fame into a new era, Robert Craig, Chair of the Museum said:

"We are delighted that the Scottish Football Hall of Fame has entered this new chapter to address the balance within the roster and to induct women who have made a outstanding impact on the game. We are thrilled to honour Elsie today, surrounded by her family, friends and admirers, and her place on our walls is very well deserved. Her commemorative plaque is now officially installed in our new look Hall of Fame display which celebrates the women who have made the game great, a fantastic new attraction for our visitors to admire and learn more about these incredible women."




Kenny and I kicked off our West Highland Way adventure at 2:40 AM from Milngavie, running on fumes after only a few hours of sleep. We navigated the dark with head torches, enjoying a beautiful sunrise over Dumgoyne. We hit Balmaha by 8:30 AM, fueled by baguettes, and tackled the Sallochy steps, which prompted an immediate "taps aff" moment as the heat began to rise.





By 11:30 AM, we reached Rowardennan, celebrating 27 miles with a well-deserved lager top. The heat intensified, leading to a blissful swim in the loch around 2 PM, which, though refreshing, threw off our timing. The relentless horseflies, or "cleggs," became our constant tormentors from this point on. A sand mishap from my bag chafed my back, adding to the misery of the unexpected, intense sun after Beinglas.



The real challenge began after midnight. Extreme fatigue and heat exhaustion caused us to "nod off" while walking, leading to terrifying hallucinations on Rannoch Moor stones became CD Walkman's and prams! We Bridge of Orchy to push through. Despite the delirium, seeing the iconic Buachaille Etive Mòr around 7:08 AM on Sunday morning sparked a much-needed second wind.

We powered up the Devil's Staircase after another brief power nap, reaching the top around 9:30 AM, utterly exhausted. The downhill into Kinlochleven was brutal on our calves and knees. After a quick resupply, the final climb out of Kinlochleven zapped the last

The last 15 miles to Fort William were a slow, scorching slog with no shade or fresh water. We resorted to splashing stream water on ourselves to keep going, clocking a painful 2 mph. Communication was reduced to grunts and



expletives about those never-ending cleggs. Finally, at 8:30 PM on Sunday evening, 42 hours after we started, we dragged our sore bodies along Fort William high street (still shirtless!). We were greeted by our mum and dad at the finish line, having completed an incredible feat and raised over £2000 for Young Minds charity, all thanks to amazing support from everyone.

Our final advice: "Don't ever try this! 'Tis a silly thing to do!"

#### From Busy to Intentional: Shifting Gears for a More Focused Autumn

With the Lodge now in its 254th year, the heritage and ties to the community are as strong as ever. However, Freemasonry is a wider organisation, and we also support causes outside the town.

The Ayrshire Freemasons' project, "Teddies for Loving Care", which commenced in August 2023, has donated over 3,300 teddy bears to the Accident and Emergency departments at Crosshouse and Ayr Hospitals to help alleviate the apprehension experienced by children attending these departments. The success of the initiative means we are now distributing to Ayrshire Paediatric Dental Services.

The Teddies for Loving Care initiative was only made possible due to the generosity of members of Lodges across Ayrshire, under the auspices of The Provincial Grand Lodge of Ayrshire (PGLA) who have collectively raised almost £1 million since 2008 and contributed generously to the £1.2 million raised as part of the Grand Lodge of Scotland's Prostate Scotland initiative. However, as the old saying goes, charity begins at home. For Lodge Thistle No. 127, Stewarton, supporting local charities, football clubs, and good causes is the key objective for its members.



The PGLA has set up an events committee to help promote the charitable works of Freemasonry, and recently had a stand at the Dundonald Highland Games, where members from across Ayrshire, including Lodge Thistle No. 127, chatted with the visitors who attended the games as conversations flowed from "What is Freemasonry" and "My Dad was a Mason" to "I never knew that you supported that charity" and "My son received one of these teddies at the hospital".

The purpose of attending events is to dispel the myth that we are a secret society and to encourage men who may be interested in becoming members to find out more. The first event was a great success, with the Lodges in Dundonald and Troon receiving interest from members who had not attended for many years and would like to return, as well as a few who would like to meet to discuss Freemasonry in more detail.






